



JUMPSUIT CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS
DOCUMENT: JUMPSUIT CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS V1.0
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- SUPPLIES NEEDED**
- 3 1/4 YARDS OF 24" WIDE FABRIC
 - SHARP SCISSORS
 - REMOVABLE MARKING MEDIUM (chalk, wax, tailor's tuck, etc.)
 - 1 - 26" NON-SEPARATING ZIPPER
 - THREAD
 - SEWING MACHINE
- optional:
- 1/2 YARD OF THINNER POCKET FABRIC
 - FUSIBLE INTERFACING

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

- Print pattern. You can print the document that on sheets of standard size paper and tape the pieces together, or print on a wide format printer (36" or wider). Print these offer this service for approximately \$12. If available to you, the PDF is recommended for easier printing.
- Once your pattern is printed, cut along the outermost rectangle to remove any excess paper. This template should fit exactly on a 36" wide or larger piece of fabric that has been folded in half. If your fabric is less than 36" wide, see **NOTE A**. For maximum yield this pattern is laid out for fabric that does not have a direction. For fabric with a nap, consult your vendor or fabric store for directional print use **NOTE B**.
- Mark your fabric or half along the lengthwise grain marking, selvage edge to selvage edge, to help in the self-finished edge of fabric. This marker helps keep the fabric from stretching or fraying. Often a blue or orange line that resembles dry lines, though not as frequently, a clearly finished line will be found. Avoid this edge in your cut pieces as the seam frequently differs from the main body of the fabric.
- Place the paper template on top your fabric, matching the folded edge of the fabric with the side of the paper marked "folded edge".
- Place pins throughout the template pinning together both layers of fabric as well as the paper.
- For around the perimeter of each piece.
- Leaving the pins in place, you will need to cut each of the pieces, taking care to not strip beyond the end of the 1/4" depth.

NOTE A: FABRIC LESS THAN 36" WIDE

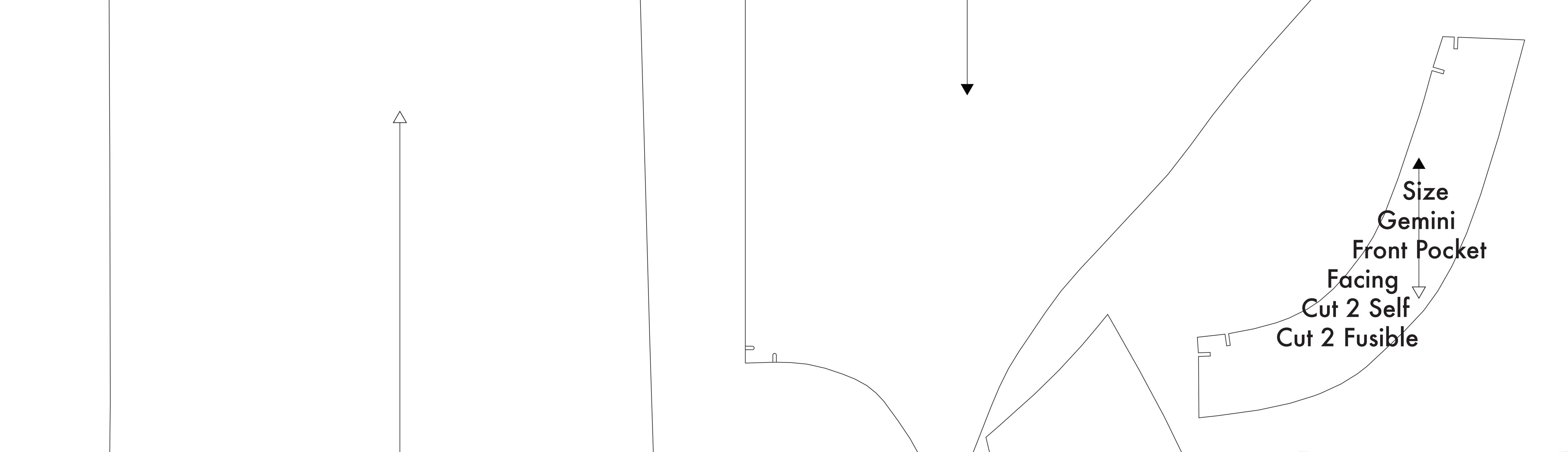
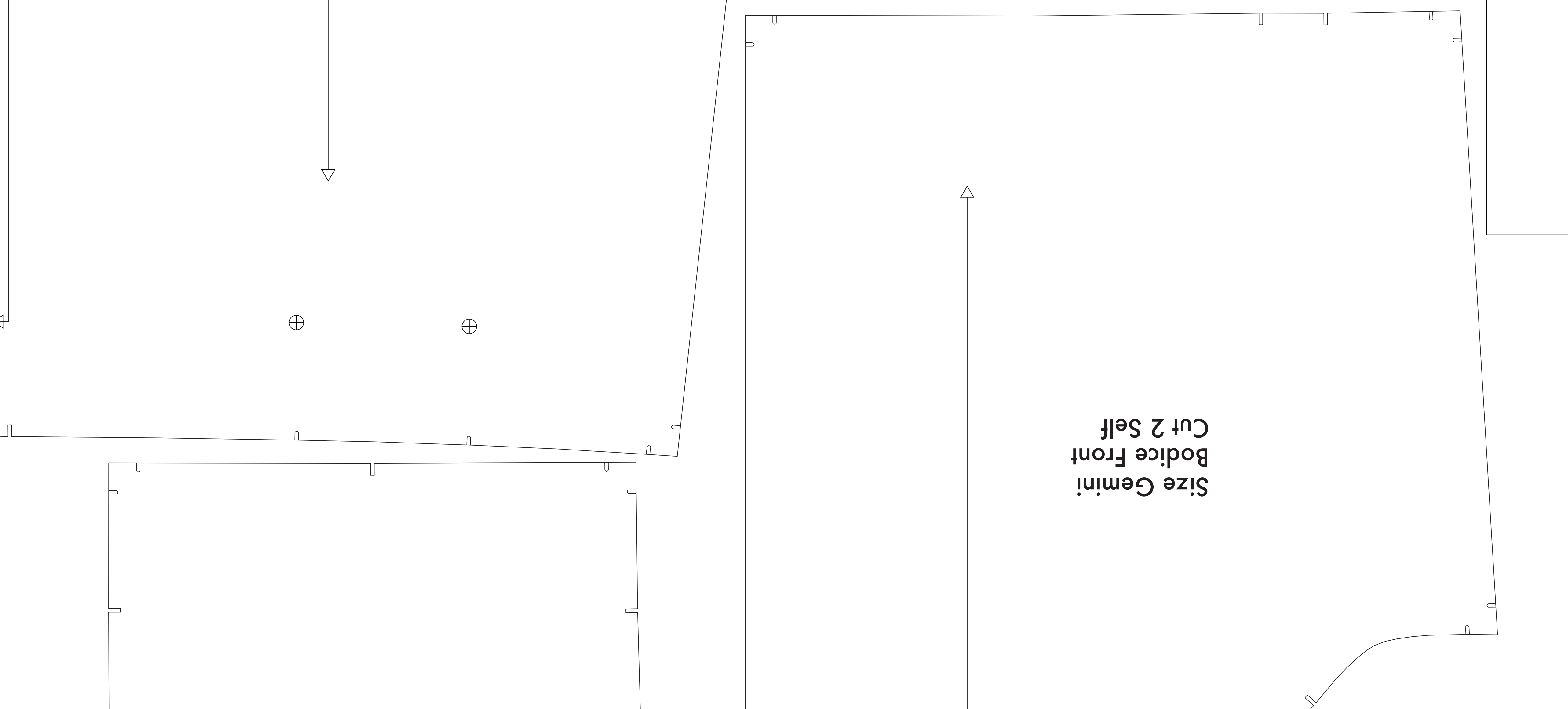
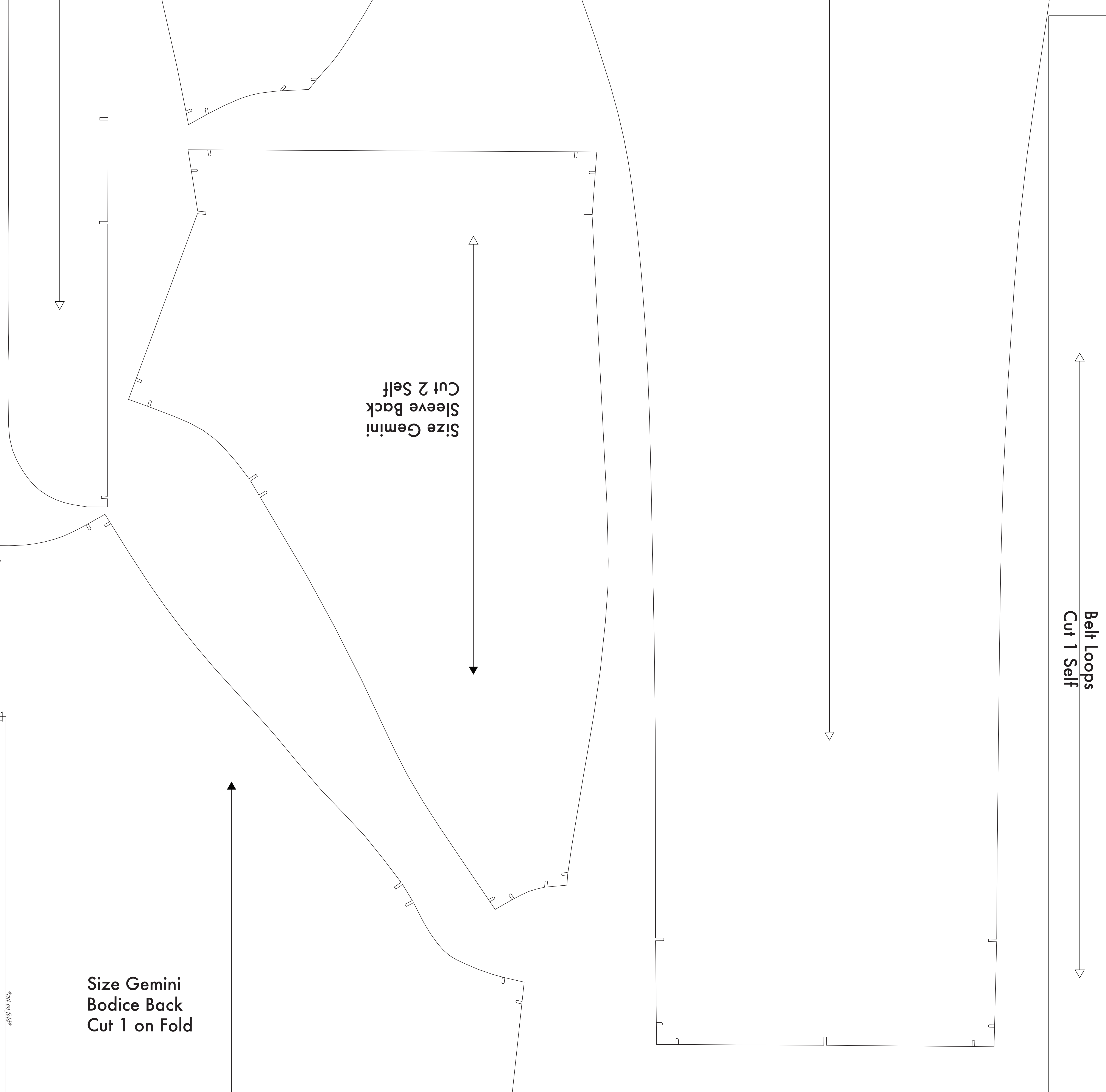
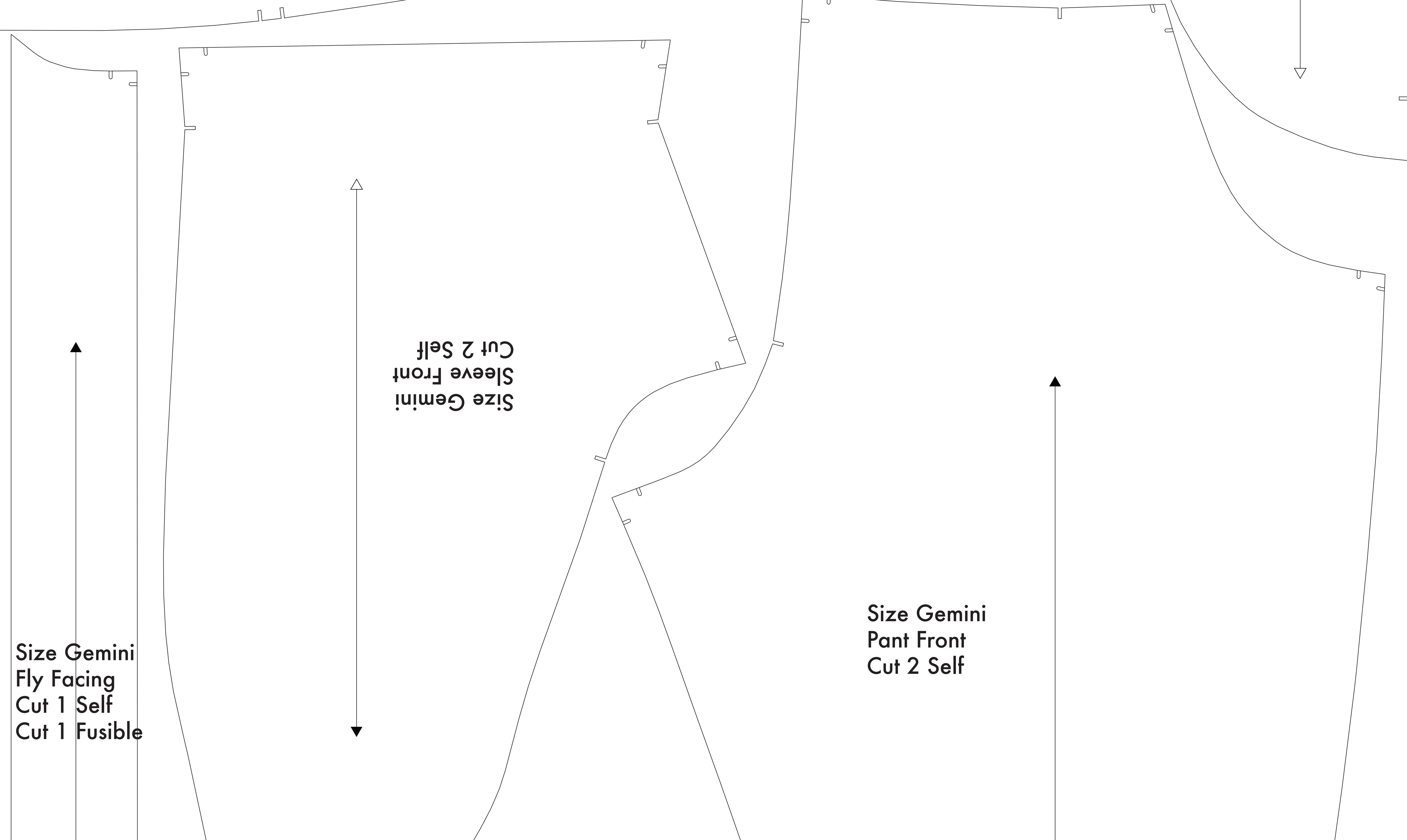
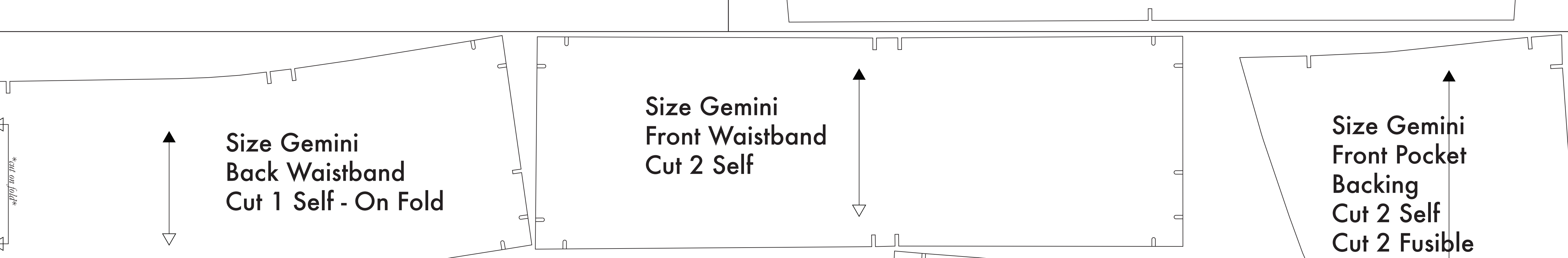
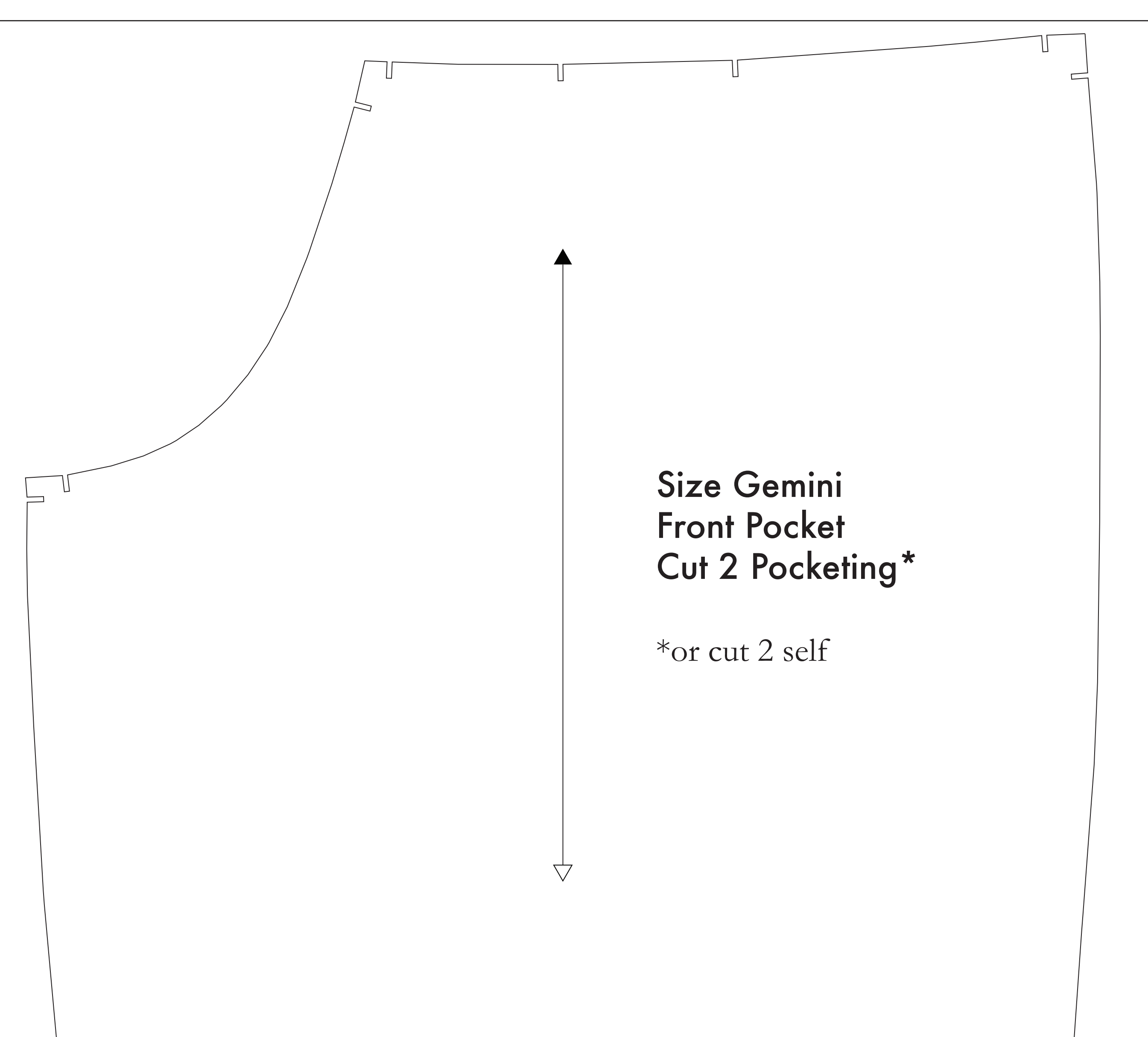
If your fabric is less than 36" wide, you will need to cut each pattern piece individually. Place the paper template and fabric together on a flat surface. Lay the paper piece on top then it is pinned down. The paper template and fabric are pinned to the surface. Then the fabric is cut along the perimeter of the paper piece for each cut. To find the paper template for the right size, see the instructions on the fabric. When you are ready to cut your fabric, place the paper template on top of the fabric. To ensure that the paper template is correctly placed, the distance from the top edge of your fabric, to the top edge of the paper template, should be the same as the distance from the top edge of your fabric, to the top edge of the paper template.

NOTE B: FABRIC WITH NAP OR DIRECTIONAL PATTERN

For fabric with a nap, such as velvet or corduroy, there will be a grain direction marked on the fabric. This direction is indicated by a line with arrows pointing in the same direction. When you are ready to cut your fabric, place the paper template on top of the fabric. To ensure that the paper template is correctly placed, the distance from the top edge of your fabric, to the top edge of the paper template, should be the same as the distance from the top edge of your fabric, to the top edge of the paper template.

NOTE C: USING FUSIBLE INTERFACING

Fusible interfacing is a material that is used to reinforce, strengthen, and hold together pieces of fabric. While the use of fusible interfacing is optional, it is highly recommended for the collar, fly, and pocket pieces. To use fusible interfacing, place the interfacing on top of the fabric, matching the edges of the fabric and the interfacing. Then, use an iron to press the interfacing into the fabric.



Before cutting your fabric measure this square to make sure that the pattern is scaled correctly*
*Some printers and software will automatically scale large images which will affect the fit.

The inner square should measure 4" x 4"
The outer square should measure 12cm x 12cm
